ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

From the office of Hanna Strydom – outgoing Learning Centre Manager at the Nelspruit HDO Learning Centre

After almost 47 years in nursing, I have been through my fair share of interviews. I would like to share some practical advice from personal experience to help you prepare and feel more confident.

Interviews can feel overwhelming, whether it is your first time or you are applying for a senior position. How you prepare and present yourself can determine whether the interview is a success or a struggle. A good or bad experience can also influence your willingness to pursue future opportunities.

Factors that can affect your performance

Many things can distract you during an interview, making it difficult to focus and answer questions effectively. You may even become emotional if sensitive topics arise.

Here are some common factors that might impact your performance:

Reasons for applying:

- Are you looking to advance your career in your current workplace?
- Are you leaving because of conflicts with colleagues?

Personal life changes:

- A sick child or family emergency may weigh on your mind.
- Marital or relationship problems can be distracting.

Practical tips for a successful interview

Before the interview:

- Research the company and position to understand what is expected of you.
- Double-check the interview details such as address, date and time.
- Prepare a list of potential questions and make notes during the interview.
- Bring all the necessary documents, such as certified copies of diplomas, proof of training, identification documents, marriage certificate and updated résumé.

On the day of the interview:

- Dress professionally. If you wear a uniform, ensure it meets the dress code.
- Arrive on time. Being late reflects poor time management and makes a bad first impression.

During the interview:

- Maintain confident body language. Sit up straight and make eye contact.
- Do not be afraid to express your opinion. If you disagree, do so respectfully and explain your reasoning.
- Answer honestly and use real-life examples to support your responses.

- If you do not understand a question, ask for clarification.
- Avoid fidgeting. Moving around too much or playing with objects (like car keys) can make you seem disinterested.

As the title of Bernard Roth's book 'The Achievement Habit (2015)' suggests: 'Stop Wishing, Start Doing, and Take Command of Your Life.' Apply this mindset to your interview preparation and you will set yourself up for success.
