We have implemented a number of measures to ensure our patients' safety, when you need it most.

- Mediclinic Hospitals and Emergency Centres are equipped to deal with both COVID-19 and non- COVID-19 related complications
- Strict policies and procedures are in place to limit the risk of infection
- All staff have been trained in infection prevention and control and precautions to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other infections
- All staff are equipped with the required personal protective equipment (PPE) to protect them against infection
- Additional cleaning rounds have been implemented and all areas are cleaned thoroughly in-between patients
- Strict hospital access control procedures have been introduced to limit the risk of transmission
- All patients will undergo testing before or on admission to confirm their COVID-19 status
 with allocation to the appropriate area for treatment
- COVID-19 and non-COVID-19 treatment areas in hospitals with limited movement of staff members

 All patients are issued with cloth masks for the duration of their admission

- confusion
- changes to your vision
- persistent vomiting and diarrhoea
